

CHOLERA AT HONDURAS. Accounts from Belize, Honduras, to August 30, received in this city, state that the Cholera had prevailed in that place and vicinity for some weeks previously, that on some days the number of deaths had been about thirty, but had fallen off, and were at last accounts about 4 or 5 per day. It had also prevailed down the coast among the mahogany cutters. The disease was supposed to have been brought by a vessel from Havana. The mortality prevailed chiefly among the negroes and the lower class of people.—[Bos. Pat.
